The following information is provided to assist the reader to understand the accounting statement and/or the Annual Governance Statement

### 1. Expenditure under S137 Local Government Act 1972

Section 137(1) of the 1972 Act permits the Council to spend on activities for which it has no other specific powers if the Council considers that the expenditure is in the interests of, and will bring direct benefit to, the area or any part of it, or all or some of its inhabitants, providing that the benefit is commensurate with the expenditure. Section 137(3) also permits the Council to incur expenditure for certain charitable and other purposes. The maximum expenditure that can be incurred under both section 137(1) and (3) for the financial year 2024-25 was £10.81 per elector.

In 2024-25, the Council made payments totalling £28,748.59 under section 137. These payments are included within 'Other payments' in the Accounting Statement.

2. Forward Planning and Governance: The Council acknowledges the need to strengthen its review of policies and procedures to ensure compliance with legislation and alignment with best practice. While progress was made in 2024–25—including the appointment of new staff, new systems, and the development of a new website—this work continues. The website, intended to replace the current third-party-managed platform, has taken longer than anticipated to implement.

A full review of contracts and policies is underway and scheduled for completion within the current financial year. Although some new policies have been introduced, several existing ones require comprehensive revision.

During the year, the Council benefited from part-time accounting and administrative support, which ensured adequate separation of financial duties and oversight/control of payments. With the new accounting system now operational, this arrangement has ended and has been addressed in 2025–26 (see Appendix – Council Payment Arrangements).

The present Council has not yet reviewed its vision and purpose. However, this will be a core element of a formal five-year business plan to be developed in 2025–26, guiding the Council's strategic direction, budgeting, and service delivery. This will also enhance compliance with the Well-being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015.

A focus on community engagement and exploration of alternative funding sources—such as grants and sponsorship—will support the implementation of the Council's objectives, including the delivery of local events, asset maintenance, and wider improvements to the town and the wellbeing of its residents.

### **Trust Funds**

Trust funds – The Council acts as sole trustee for and is responsible for managing trust fund(s)/assets. We exclude transactions related to these trusts from the Accounting Statement. In our capacity as trustee, we have discharged our responsibility in relation to the accountability for the fund(s) including financial reporting and, if required, independent examination or audit.
